2022 will see the inaugural launching of two new races to be hosted by Little Ships Fleet YC. This is significant for the racers and for the Club in general as it enhances our standing in the local boating community. With this addition we will be hosting a total of four races. The ASPBYC race schedule is very crowded

and it was no small feat to get two Saturday dates added. For those who don't know, ASPBYC is the umbrella organization that maintains and coordinates the racing schedules of all the local clubs.

The two new races will be a little different than the usual "around the buoys" races which use fixed marks in and around Long Beach Harbor. The new races will have just one mark, Oil Platform *Edith*, which lies approximately eight miles off shore — so around Platform *Edith* and back for a total distance of about 16 miles. These two races will be known as "*Little Ships Fleet Offshore Series*". When I made this announcement at the recent meeting of the Hi Point series clubs and explained the concept, it was met with approval and some enthusiasm. Some logistics are still to be worked out and to that end I have been working with Commodore Moti Cohen-Doron, Ben Smith, Frank Franco and Dick Martin who have all contributed valuable input.

Speaking of the meeting of the four Hi Point Series Clubs, informally chaired by S/C Ben Smith, the schedule for the eight Hi Point races was hammered out and the complete schedule will appear in January issue of Three Sheets. The two Hi Point races (*Beat the Heat* and the new renamed *Reach to the Beach*) LSFYC will host will be **June 4** and **July 16**. And last but not least the dates of the *Little Ships Fleet Offshore Series* will be **May 14** and **August 6**.

Much more to come - watch this space. Smooth sailing everyone.
