



Elections of LSFYC Officers for 2020

As we slowly approach the end of the sailing season, one of the requisite functions that occurs at this time is the preparation for election of new Flag Officers for the coming year. Per the Bylaws, this process begins by the consideration of potential candidates by the Nominating Committee (otherwise known as *The Five Old Salts*) and by the members, then the subsequent posting of the selected nominees to be voted upon in **November** by the general membership. One or more members may be nominated for each office. Briefly, the elective officers and their duties are:

Commodore: Executive Officer of the club and presides at all club and Board meetings. Represents the club at outside yacht club functions.

Vice Commodore: assists the Commodore in his duties and in his absence shall act in his stead.

Rear Commodore: assists the Commodore and Vice Commodore by organizing and executing the social functions of the club.

Fleet Captain: presides over all of the club racing activities.

Port Captain: performs duties related to on site club functions such as purchasing supplies, maintaining facilities and chief BBQer.

Secretary: records all proceedings of club meetings and performs tasks related to any mailings.

Treasurer: collects dues, accounts for and banks all monies, pays the bills.

Director: provides guidance and contributes suggestions, decisions on the direction of the club.

Another benefit of holding an office is the attending of the Annual **Opening Days** of the various Yacht Clubs of Southern Calif. Each club opens it's yachting season with a ceremony and celebration with visiting officers of other clubs in attendance. This provides the opportunity to visit the other clubs, meet the officers and discuss the issues and problems involved with operating a club and possible solutions.

It is at this time we ask the LSFYC members to consider fulfilling any role in the club as stated above. The Directorship is a good place to begin (even after an election, a volunteering Director may be appointed). Every member is eligible and there is substantial support and mentoring from the Staff Commodores to help to allow an easy transition into each of the roles. Yes, it some work, but there is a fun factor and the satisfaction of getting something done....successfully.
