America's Cup racing will return in Jan, Feb & March of 2021. At present, New Zealand holds the Cup and is hosting the event in Auckland. ESPN will probably partner with SkySports to air it locally. There will be live broadcasts, but NZ is a day and some hours ahead of us(?)(I know, right?!) so check your local listings as they say.

Speaking of AC boats, technology is the order of the day. The R&D of the individual syndicates (the owners) is closely guarded - hush, hush, if you will. I understand very little of the technology involved, but I will give you a little taste of what's going on. Take spinnakers, for example. On the AC boats you will never see a spinnaker! Never. In our "normal" sailing, the spinnaker is the most important down wind sail, but the AC boats are never sailing down wind. Is that even possible? Well yes, if you're sailing *faster* than the wind, the *apparent* wind is always forward of the beam, which means your sails are always trimmed for *upwind* sailing. And yes, these boats can sail up to three times the speed of the wind, depending on conditions, of course. This is way over simplified. There are many, many factors involved, but I'll leave it there for lack of time, space and expertise.

BTW there are plenty of great sailing videos on YouTube. Plenty of good books out there too. Stay safe everyone and have a great holiday season.
