Signals from Fleet Captain Nate Tucker



LSF is hosting two more races this season: July 16, part of the Hi Point series (this race dubbed *Beat the Heat*) and August 6, the second race in the LSF Off Shore Series. We're hoping for a good turnout for both. As always, everyone is invited to join the race skippers

and crews at our facility for the after-race bash, featuring food and trophy presentations. Speeches will be kept to a minimum.

Also I can share an update on the highly anticipated solo circumnavigation planned by Captain **Kevin McQuiston**, now a member of Little Ships Fleet. In or about October of 2023, Captain McQuiston will depart Long Beach and head generally southeast, round Cape Horn, South America, continue easterly, traversing the Southern Ocean, leaving Cape of Good Hope, Africa, to port, cross the Indian Ocean, leaving Tasmania. Australia to port, thence northeasterly traversing the Pacific Ocean, finally arriving back to Southern California.

He's anticipating 170 days covering some 23,000 nautical miles. He will be alone. There will be no escort. This has not been done before. We will be able to follow the voyage via T.V. and podcasts, provided by Discovery Channel and/or Disney. The boat will be fitted with multiple cameras and also he'll deploy a drone for aerial shots as the boat is sailing. I've had a lengthy conversation with Captain McQuiston and have a lot more information to share in succeeding issues of Three Sheets. Definitely stay tuned.

Wishing you all nothing but fair winds and green lights.
