He could drive from his wheelchair and he would roll over to the front doors at Little Ships Fleet Yacht Club to Say Hello With A Great Big Smile! I'd grab a chair and we would go over to the rails and we would sit in the shade of the big old tree at NYCLB.

He was a charmer that guy Dennis, and smart too, but just like he drifted into our lives he drifted away. His ashes were taken out to sea last week and on that day I drifted here afterward and a dolphin drifted here, then a baby seagull came to sit here and even a butterfly fluttered by here. I'd like to believe that it was Dennis drifting here to bring these gifts to let me know I'm not watching the bay alone but that he is in the swells and tides. He's in the ripples the dolphins glide through He is the water the baby seagulls now float on and he is free in the drink we call the vast blue ocean.
