Hello Little Shippers!

Spring is right around the corner and with it comes the racing season. So what better time to take a look back through the history of our club, and the impact Little Ships Fleet has had on racing.

Eighty seven years ago this month (before Little Ships was officially a club), Frank Davenport and five of his friends had the great idea to develop a handicap system to allow boats of different classes to race in the same regatta.

Prior to this system if you didn't have a boat that was in a designated class, you couldn't participate in a sanctioned race. In order to create a handicap, Frank Davenport and his cohorts needed some data on how these smaller, non-class boats would perform. In March of 1937 the racing of the "forgotten fleets" began and the rest is, as they say, history. Davenport's boat *Guess Again* (pictured below), performed well in the races. In one such race Davenport's wife, Mildred Coleman, took first place defeating E.Y. Sullivan's *Avisa* by 13 minutes. If Sullivan thought he had a fast boat, he should Guess Again.

Davenport and his friends would lay the foundation for the PHRF rating system as well as form the Little Ships Fleet of Long Beach, leaving a lasting impact on the sport of sailing as we know it. So let's get involved, let's get racing, and let's make Frank and Mildred Coleman proud!

(I would like to mention that this information as well as much, much more, comes from the beautiful history book presented to the club by Howard and Eunice Kupfer in 1962. If you haven't already, you should come down to The Shed and check it out!)
