This Old Boat

Since purchasing the 40 year old Tollycraft 30 ft power boat *Cantamar* some years ago, I have spent some time (and \$\$\$) in maintaining the mechanics and upgrading components in order to enjoy the boat and stay on top of the functionality. As with all boat owners, I want it to last as long as possible. Fortunately, the 2 big gas V8s had been rebuilt and are purring like 2 big fat cats.

But as with an automobile, over time, components wear out. Especially anything involving rotating items. Such was the recent case with a propeller shaft cutlass bearing. The bearing is the sleeve that resides inside the prop shaft support strut which the prop shaft runs thru. The bearing keeps the shaft aligned from engine to prop. The bearing is just a brass tube with a serrated rubber inner liner. The tube is press fitted into the strut. (see an example at right).

One day, while out in the harbor, I heard banging under the hull at the left engine. Shutting down the engine and heading back to the slip on the right engine, I thought that I had picked up some kelp. Once back in the slip, I called the diver to come at first chance to take a look and remove any obstructions. Two days later, he called and told me that not only was there kelp wrapped on the shaft but that the cutlass bearing rubber insert had been pushed out of the sleeve. &%\$##@! Now, I thought, I have to get the boat pulled out to pull the prop and install a new bearing!

"...not to worry amigo!" the diver tells me "I know a guy who can install the new bearing underwater!" WHAT! So I call Bob Harris from Pro Tech Dive Works who tells me that he has tools and equipment to remove the old and install the new bearing without moving the boat from the slip. After determining the correct size of the bearing to replace, Bob shows up with his assistant (the diver) and hydraulic equipment that pushes out the old and pushes in the new bearing.

After removing the 17" dia (the size of a '55 Buick hub cap) bronze propeller, hooking up the jig and hydraulic pins to push out the old bearing, then reversing the jig to push in the new bearing, the job was done. However, the inspection of both props revealed bent blades! They being 40 years old, it was not unexpected. &%##@! Now, I thought, I'll have to buy new props!

"...not to worry amigo!" Bob tells me "I know a guy who can recondition the propellers!" WHAT! So I call Gary at Wilmington Propellers who tells me that they can straighten the blades, balance and polish the props to a like new condition. Boat performance will improve as well he says.

I got the props back the following week for the diver to install and me to test. There was a definite

improvement in performance and smoothness of operation of the boat!

There will probably be some other item to eventually wear out and have to deal with, but as long as one guy knows another guy that can fix it, all is good!

LITTLE SHIPS FLEET SHED HOUSE RULES

As a benefit of membership, the "Shed" is for the exclusive use by LSFYC members for official club meetings or member private events. The use and occupancy of the shed is for the continued *benefit and enjoyment* of the LSFYC members and their guests, consequently, the following rules apply at all times:

Unless otherwise notified and for events other than official LSFYC scheduled events or in presence of any LSFYC Officer, the shed to be open from 9:00 am until 8:00 pm. No open flame cooking of food in shed (other than use of microwave) is allowed. Cleanup of all portions of any food items in shed after use to be completed before departure.

Shed is to always be maintained in a clean and *odor free* condition and is subject to monthly cleaning of floor and counter tops.

Per Bylaws: "LSFYC members are held responsible for the conduct of themselves as well as their family members and guests at all LSFYC functions and related activities within the yachting community". This applies to conduct at the shed as well.

Alcoholic beverage consumption is allowed within the shed. Consumption is not allowed on the city marina walkways or parking lot. Please drink responsibly. NO smoking in or near Shed.

Unruly or excessively loud behavior by any member or guest will result in being asked to leave the premises.

No discussion or promotion of a political topic or position allowed.

Shed contents only to be of items necessary for entertainment or function of the shed. NO personal items (except for personal alcohol) shall be stored or be accumulated in the cabinets or refrigerator.

Pets may be allowed on the premises, however:

No pets at scheduled LSFYC events at the shed where a large member turnout is expected, otherwise small gatherings are OK.

Pets must be on lease and held by owner at all times and are not allowed inside the shed

Pets not allowed with radius of 12 feet of the shed doors when food is served and being consumed by members.

No feeding of snacks or table scraps to pets from or near tables where food is being serviced will be allowed.

Cause of disturbance or unruly behavior by pets will result in removal.


